**Revisions to OSS Section 3.1.1:** Compulsory Credit Requirements

**Date of Issue:** February 01, 2006 **Effective:** September 01, 2005

**Summary:** Compulsory credit requirements may now be met through the

completion of additional eligible courses in Group 1, 2 and 3.

## **Current Eligible Compulsory Courses**

- ✓ 4 credits in English (1 credit per grade)
- ✓ 1 credit in French as a second language
- ✓ 3 credits in mathematics (at least 1 credit in Grade 11 or 12)
- ✓ 2 credits in science
- ✓ 1 credit in Canadian history
- ✓ 1 credit in Canadian geography
- ✓ 1 credit in the arts
- ✓ 1 credit in health and physical education
- ✓ 1/2 credit in civics and 1/2 credit in career studies

### Group 1: Current Eligible Courses-

1 additional credit in English, or a third language, or social sciences and the humanities, or Canadian and World Studies

#### **New Additional Eligible Courses:**

✓ Learning Strategies: GLE10, GLE20, GLS10, GLE30, GLE40, GLS40

✓ Discovering the Workplace: GLD2O
✓ Designing Your Future; GWL3O
✓ Leadership and Peer Support: GPP3O

Group 2: Current Eligible Courses-	1 additional credit in health and physical education, or the arts,
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or business studies

**Group 3:** Current Eligible Courses- 1 additional credit in science (Gr. 11 or 12) or technological education

(Gr. 9–12)

New Additional Eligible Courses: A cooperative education credit \*

\*Note: A maximum of <u>two</u> Cooperative Education credits can be used to fulfill compulsory requirements.

### **Revisions to OSS Section 3.2:** Substitutions for Compulsory Credit Requirements

**Date of Issue:** February 01, 2006 **Effective:** September 01, 2005

**Summary:** The limit of **3 substitutions** remains in effect. However, the range of

courses that can be used for substitutions for compulsory credit requirements has been extended to include the following courses:

### **Current Eligible Compulsory Courses which can be used as Substitutions:**

- ✓ 4 credits in English (1 credit per grade)
- ✓ 1 credit in French as a second language
- ✓ 3 credits in mathematics (at least 1 credit in Grade 11 or 12)
- ✓ 2 credits in science
- ✓ 1 credit in Canadian history
- ✓ 1 credit in Canadian geography
- ✓ 1 credit in the arts
- ✓ 1 credit in health and physical education
- ✓ 1/2 credit in civics and 1/2 credit in career studies

**Group 1:** 1 additional credit in English, or a third language, or social sciences and the humanities, or

Canadian and World Studies

**Group 2:** 1 additional credit in health and physical education, or the arts, or business studies

**Group 3:** 1 additional credit in science (Gr. 11 or 12) or technological education (Gr. 9–12)

#### **New Additional Eligible Substitution Courses:**

✓ Learning Strategies: GLE10, GLE20, GLS10, GLE30, GLE40, GLS40

✓ Discovering the Workplace: GLD2O
✓ Designing Your Future; GWL3O
✓ Leadership and Peer Support: GPP3O
✓ Navigating the Workplace: GLN4O

### **Substitution Limitations:**

- A maximum of one credit for a learning strategies course can be used through substitution to meet a compulsory credit requirement.
- Cooperative Education credits cannot be used through substitution to meet compulsory requirements.
