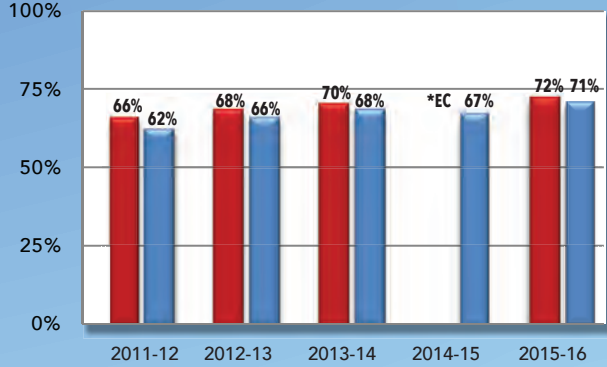

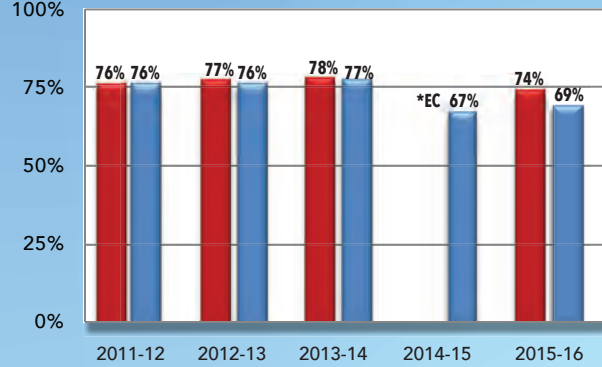

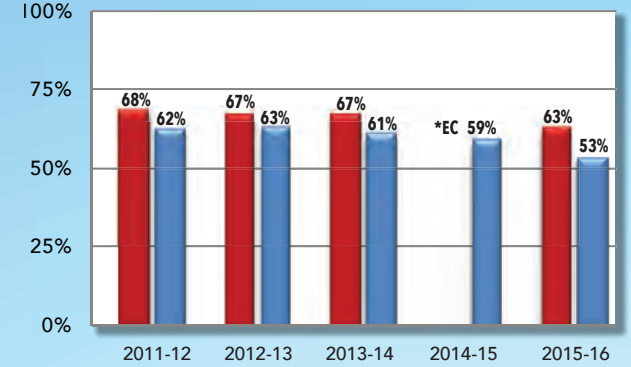
Percentage of Students At or Above Provincial Standard in Grade 3 Reading



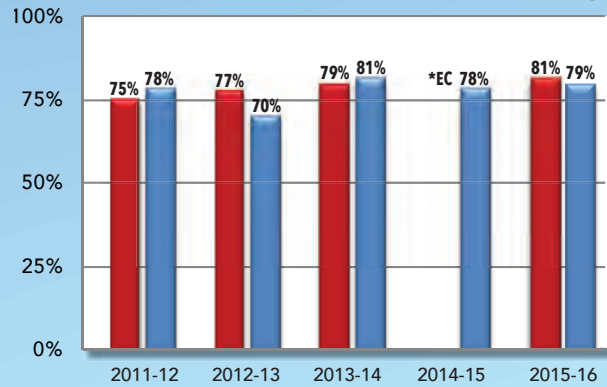
Percentage of Students At or Above Provincial Standard in Grade 3 Writing



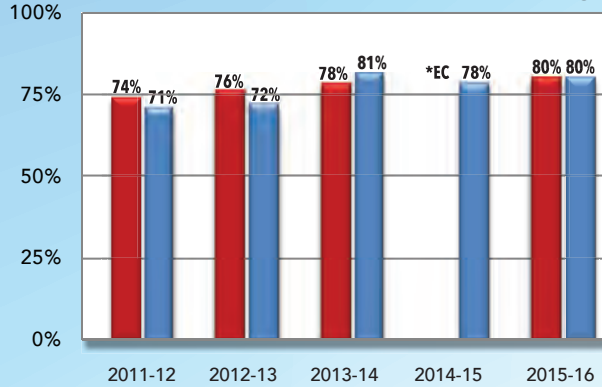
Percentage of Students At or Above Provincial Standard in Grade 3 Math



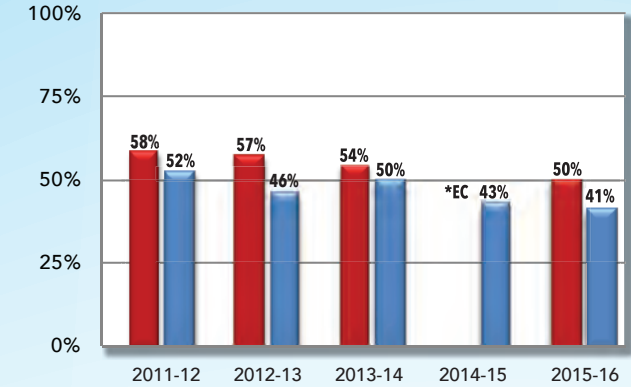
Percentage of Students At or Above Provincial Standard in Grade 6 Reading



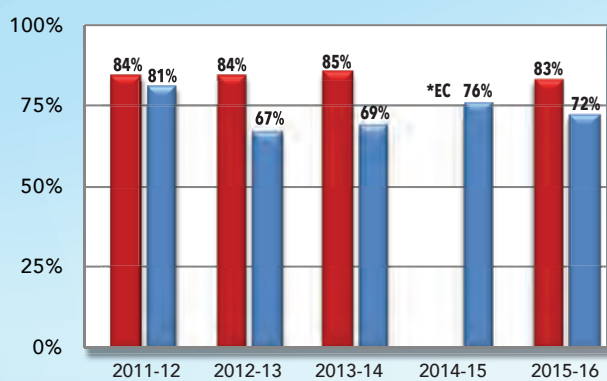
Percentage of Students At or Above Provincial Standard in Grade 6 Writing



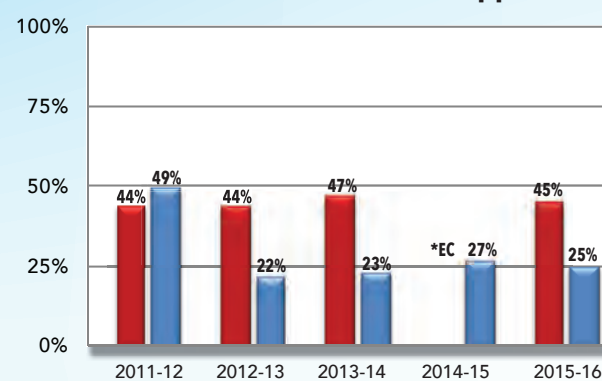
Percentage of Students At or Above Provincial Standard in Grade 6 Math



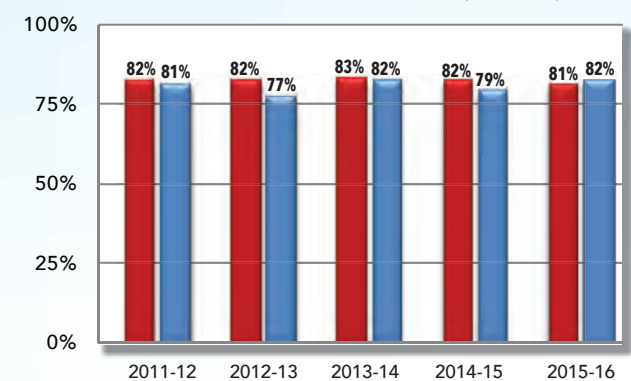
Percentage of Students At or Above Provincial Standard in Grade 9 Academic Math

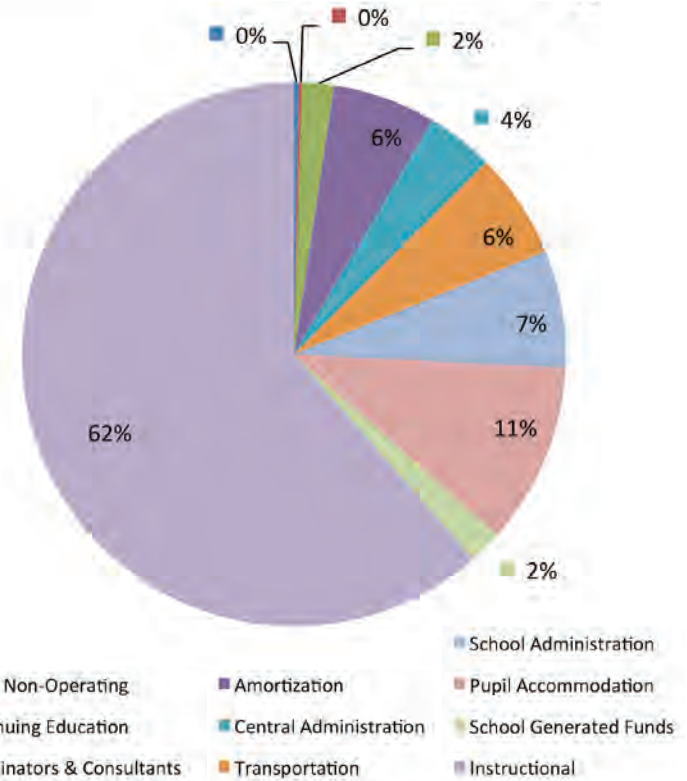
In partnership with the Board, our members work hard every day to provide the complete education our children deserve.
