
Percentage of Students At or Above Provincial Standard in Grade 3 Reading




Percentage of Students At or Above Provincial Standard in Grade 6 Reading




### Percentage of Students At or Above Provincial Standard in Grade 9 Academic Math




Percentage of Students At or Above Provincial Standard in Grade 3 Writing




Percentage of Students At or Above Provincial Standard in Grade 6 Writing




Percentage of Students At or Above Provincial Standard in Grade 9 Applied Math




### Percentage of Students At or Above Provincial Standard in Grade 3 Math


We are very proud of the role CUPE members play in the HSCDSB to provide the complete education our children deserve.


