Kindergarten Grade One & Two NEWS

December arrived in the blink of an eye! The students are working hard in the classroom and time is flying. The hallways are filled with some amazing writing activities by the students and their duotangs are full of work! This group is so hardworking and loves learning. It's very exciting to watch their growth the past couple of months.

The Y1 and Y2 students are really enjoying learning two letters per week from the Open Court Program. They are eager to share their knowledge and are so excited to brainstorm words that begin with that letter. They are perfecting their penmanship skills and love writing words! The Grade 1/2 students are becoming experts at writing sentences and challenging themselves to add extra detail. They are learning to perfect their printing, beginning with capital letters, ending with punctuation, and using finger spaces between their words. We will begin adding more to their writing to build their writing stamina. Each day, they are called up for Guided Reading and they come running! The confidence and excitement that they are reading is amazing to see! They are improving with their reading strategies to decode unfamiliar words and love reading new books each week. For the month of December, we will divide the three weeks into themes. Week 1 is Elf Week, Week 2 is Grinch Week, and Week 3 is the Polar Express Week. We will read books, make crafts, writing activities, and STEM activities! We are continuing our Open Court Program and we are so close to completing the alphabet! Way to go!

In Math, we begin a new Patterning unit. This unit involves recognizing, creating, and extending repeating patterns. They are going to identify the core of each pattern and find the pattern rule. The students will be introduced to new math learning games and will be perfecting their teamwork skills by solving problems together in small group settings.

We will be moving into a new Social Studies Unit: Roles and Responsibilities. This unit involves the students comparing home and school life, identifying significant people, respectful behaviour, features of our local community, and being responsible in our community. In STEM, the students will learn to build Christmas Trees, Build a table to hold Santa's milk and cookies, and to build a fence to keep the reindeer from getting loose. They love STEM challenges. Add in a Candy Cane Experiment or two! December is going to be fun.

We are beginning an amazing time of year...Advent! The students will read and explore the true

meaning of Christmas, as they await the birth of Jesus.

Jersey Day

Grade Two, Three, Four NEWS

Snowy wishes from the grade 2/3/4 class! We are excited for the season of Christmas and all that it brings!

This month will fly by with many new units to begin. In Math students will be learning about Financial Literacy, Fractions and Money, a perfect time to learn about how to save and value money for long term goals. Students will use coins and bills and will participate in some pretend shopping to calculate change.

We have earned 3 virtual coding sessions with trained coders and our class will enjoy this very much! Last year students created codes for Paw Patrol, Avengers and Minecraft characters, they loved it!

Students will learn how to make healthy choices during our Healthy Eating unit in Health as well as continue to develop cooperation and good sportsmanship skills through our daily activities and games. Please be sure your children come ready for outdoor play too! Advent is here and our class will listen to stories about the days before Jesus' birth and how important December 25th, his birthday is for Christians. We will celebrate through prayers, writings and discussions.

Our UFLI lessons in Language for grade 2 students are going very well! They are enjoying the interactive lessons and are really engaged. We have been working on our short vowel sounds, reading and writing words with them and will continue to practice irregular words and letters sounds this month.

Grade 3's and 4's will develop their knowledge of proper nouns, possessive pronouns, apostrophe and quotation marks in their writing as well as spending time developing reading, spelling and syllable skills while using Lexia. All students will be creating an ad through the use of posters, commercials or role play to sell a product and will present it to their peers. It will be a lot of fun!

Social Studies will cover Changing Family and Community Traditions in grade 2, Communities in Canada from 1780-1850 in grade 3 and Early Societies in 1500 CE for the grade 4's. Students will focus on a specific topic and create a pamphlet or short magazine that represents their topic.

I'm happy that November is finally over. The Grade 5/6/7/8 Class has been working very hard, and everyone, myself included is looking forward to the Christmas break with anticipation. In French for November we really focused on preparing ourselves for winter! We worked on learning the French words for winter clothing, and the older grades have been learning to use these words in sentences!

When we finished with winter clothing, we moved onto winter sports! We learned the different words for the sports and we wrapped up our unit by inventing our own winter sports, complete with a mascot! We also did some research on famous Olympian Athletes and did a French write up about them!

For Music we have been learning how to read sheet music and how to identify what notes match certain piano keys! For December we are going to shift to CHRISTMAS!! We are going to learn a whole bunch of new vocabulary words all centering around "Noel."

We are also going to be adding singing to our music lessons as we practice some songs for the Christmas play!
