KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION is being accepted for September.



Kindergarten Grade One & Two NEWS

We are so proud of our students for their amazing work preparing for the Lenten Season and Holy Week. They are such a spiritual group of students and they are growing closer to God each day. We have been learning about Lent and Holy Week, preparing displays, and working together to complete special Holy Week activities for the hallway. They truly are a special gift from God.

In Open Court, Y1 students continue to learn their letters, letter blends, letter sounds, and they are beginning to write words independently. They are growing in confidence during their writing workshop to write full sentences independently.

Our Y2, Grade 1 and Grade 2 students continue to use the UFLI program and are loving it! The growth and progress is amazing in their word blending skills, reading strategies and decoding skills, and writing. They are working on writing paragraphs independently, using the proper letter formation, finger spaces and punctuation. Added with our Guided Reading Program, they are gaining the confidence to read with confidence and decoding difficult words independently. It's amazing to see the growth happening in the classroom. The students really love our 6+1 Write Traits program, they are always eager to work with the teacher to write creative and unique stories. They are really allowing their imagination to soar. This month we will be exploring rhyming words and Poetry.

In Math, we are concluding our Addition and Subtraction unit. We will move into our Algebra Unit, this involves exploring patterns. We will explore and create repeating patterns, growing patterns and shrinking patterns. We will be using hands-on games and manipulatives for this unit. The Grade 1 students will explore number patterns.

In Science, we will explore Earth Science by examining the solar system, the sun and the moon. We will also explore different natural and man-made resources. We will learn about uses of land, water, and caring for the Earth. Of course, add in some fun and exciting Earth Day activities. Our Science unit will tie into a brand new Dramatic Play Centre: The Space Station. They love this centre! We have a rocket ship, the solar system, a telescope, and a weigh station and microscope to examine space rocks. They love learning about the different planets in our solar system and each week they get so excited to learn more on this subject. We love their eagerness.



Grade Two, Three, Four NEWS

April is here! In a flash we are into a new month! The grade 2, 3, 4 class is anxiously waiting for Spring-like weather to arrive and STAY! In the meantime we are keeping diligent with our daily routines and lessons.

In Math we are continuing to work through Spatial Sense Measurement, Time, Location, and Movement Measurement as well, we will begin Data with a focus on Probability. Students are making good progress in Spatial Sense and expect to see some homework pages coming home if work has not been completed during class time.

Religion will continue to focus on Easter and the Resurrection of Jesus, through stories, discussions and activities.
Students have completed discussing the Story of Easter Booklet and have brought them home to share with family. I hope you all have a blessed Easter shared with loved ones!

Language will provide students the opportunity for more practice with their writing skills and examining Media Literacy. We will be taking a look at magazine articles, advertisements, and websites to learn more about how this form can influence an audience. Students will then create their own piece to share with their peers and determine how effective their writing has been.

We will start to explore People and Their Environments and build an understanding of how people live and grow as community members in different locations. Our Matter and Energy unit will also continue and wrap up this month, more experiments to come, which is always fun!

Next month we will be shifting our focus once again and will be introducing some Spring words and starting a whole new unit which is yet to be determined!


We are also going to be starting a new drama unit this month!
