The vision of the HSCDSB Hockey Canada Skills Academy is to enhance a student-athlete's confidence, promote leadership skills, individual playing skills, self-esteem and opportunities in both academics and athletics beyond the elementary and secondary school system.

Applications are being accepted from students who will be in grades 5, 6, 7 and 8 at St. Basil Catholic Elementary School and grades 9 and 10 at St. Mary's College, for entry into our 2021/2022 program.

NOTE: Successful applicants outside the St. Basil School zone, will be required to request out-of-zone approval. Parents will be responsible for arranging transportation to and from the school.

Through the Academy, students will have the ability to participate in the Hockey Canada Skills Curriculum, with a focus on guidelines based on an on-ice curriculum framework focusing on individual offensive and situational play, and an off-ice curriculum framework focusing on body coordination and skill development.

Overview:

- As many as 40 on-ice learning opportunities each school year (Elementary programming Sept. –June)
- As many as 40 on-ice learning opportunities each school year (Secondary programming)
- Individualized training developed by Hockey Canada focused on student strengths and weaknesses
- Sports-specific strength and conditioning training focused on long-term athletic development
- Promotion of overall good health, beginning with the development of sound food and nutrition habits

- They are motivated, self-directed learners capable of working independently and completing work on time
- They are passionate for the game of hockey and aspire to improve their skills

Program Review

I understand that the school will provide ongoing review of student needs related to program delivery, available resources and program fit. If my child's ongoing needs (academic or behavioural) prove greater than the supports available within the HSCDSB Hockey Canada Skills Academy, a review and consultation will occur with the parent, classroom teacher and administrator to determine the student's suitability for continued placement in the program. The final decision will rest with the principal.

Home / School Communication

Specialized Learning Programs seek to establish an active, collaborative, supportive learning community of students, parents, and teachers. Certain guidelines need to be followed to ensure a positive experience for the entire learning community. Parents are expected to relate to staff and other parents in a positive and professional manner using appropriate conflict resolution procedures to help create a supportive learning environment. Transportation

The Hockey Academy has been structured to offer the on-ice portion during school hours. With transportation being an integral and expensive undertaking for the program, student athletes are required to act responsibly in their efforts to meet departure times and exhibit appropriate behaviour / conduct while in transport. If a student requires alternative methods of transportation, the school office must be notified in advance. Students are not permitted to accept rides from anyone other than parents or guardians.

Funding

The HSCDSB Hockey Canada Skills Academy provides a unique opportunity for student athletes to promote their individual skill development while concurrently achieve academic credit. As an elective program, it has associated costs that exceed the funding of a regular day-school program.

Program Costs:

A registration cost of \$650.00/elementary or \$700/secondary is charged to each participant (based on enrolment) and covers:

- Transportation to and from the rink and dry-land training facility. (HSCDSB Bus Code of Conduct applies to all transportation provided for during this program), Ice rental, Hockey Canada Skills Academy Participant Registration, one Hockey Canada Skills Academy Jersey, one Hockey Academy Gym Uniform

Admission Considerations:

- Student applicants must be registered and enrolled in grades 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 or 10.
- If financial assistance is required, parents will be notified upon admission to the program.
- Students must demonstrate a strong commitment to their overall academics and, ongoing success in all learning skills. More specifically, preference will be given to students who demonstrate a strong commitment to: co-operation with others, independent work habits, and the willingness to set goals for improvement.
- The program strives for a balance of male and female participants.
- The school principal will give applicants final approval of acceptance into the program.
- A lottery will decide placement if the number of successful applicants exceeds the space in the program.
- If more than one student applies from a family/household and the placement decision is based on a lottery, all students from the household will be offered placement in the program upon one sibling being drawn.
- Successful applicants not drawn will be offered a place on a wait list.
- For students out of zone, out of zone approval must be obtained.
- Students accepted into the HSCDSB Hockey Canada Skills Academy will complete a HSCDSB Hockey Academy Contract at the beginning of each year and/or semester they attend the program.
