Faith:

- Students were recognized for the virtue of COURAGE during our morning prayer on October 31. More staff have been nominating students for the virtue of the month lately.
- There are more staff attending our Staff Morning Prayer Tuesdays and Thursdays in the Chapel at 8:10. When Miss Parniak is out of the school on either of those days one of the other staff members leads. Thank you to Mr. Rocchetta who helped out this month. The ILS 2 class participated in a prayer service on All Saints' Day. We talked about the qualities of saints, saints that they knew (often linked with the names of schools and churches in town) as well as saints that match their names. The prayer service concluded with praying a Litany of Saints.
- Miss Parniak has wrapped up the One Block Retreats which included every grade 9 and 10 morning class. They were well received by students and staff. Many students commented on how calming meditation in the Chapel was.
- Miss Parniak led retreats for Mrs. Vallecorsa's and Miss Johnson's grade 8 classes out at St. Kateri. This was assisted by Mr. Sicoly. The theme revolved around transitions of the seasons and our lives. "There is a time for everything and a season for every activity under the sun." (Ecclesiastes 3:1)
- Fr. Charles, the new priest at St. Gerard Majella, visited St. Mary's College and was provided with a tour. He indicated that he is interested in working with our school community.
- Our Breakfast Program has noticed an increase in the number of students accessing food. It is set up in the front lobby of the school from 8:00 8:30 and run by Mrs. Reid and a student in ILS1 so students can access items for breakfast. Food items are also in Miss Parniak's office for those needing access during the day and at lunch. We are grateful to Debbie in the cafeteria who is ordering some of our food items which decreases shopping to once a week for Miss Parniak.
- Planning is underway for Remembrance Day. To prepare, staff have the option of bringing classes to the auditorium by grade level on Nov. 10th or showing a few selected videos in their morning classrooms. There will be a school wide prayer service over the PA on Nov. 11 at 10:45 with all stopping for a moment of silence in solidarity with other Canadians.

- The boys Football season has come to an end. The Junior team lost in the city final and the Senior team lost in the semi finals to Superior Heights.
- Girls Basketball concluded Thursday, November 11. Currently, the Junior Knights are in 2nd place and the Senior Knights are in 3rd place. Playoffs are the week of the 8th. City Finals were on Friday, November 12 and NOSSA play downs in North Bay on November 19 and 20.
- Boys Basketball Tryouts have begun and the season will start the 3rd week of November.
