Electronic tenders for the Renovations at Our Lady of Lourdes French Immersion Catholic School and Our Lady of Fatima Catholic School project were received at the office of MET Energy Systems in Sault Ste. Marie on April 12, 2023. One tender was received, with result as follows:

Total Stipulated Price

Quinan Construction

\$1,531,378

The budgeted cost for the project is \$1,275,000. This budget was increased from \$800,000 as a result of cancelling the Our Lady of Fatima Catholic School, Chapleau, Barrier-Free Upgrades project and the optional Secure Access Systems project. The remaining shortfall (\$256,378) will be expended from the SCI/SRA contingency (\$709,450).

The Huron-Superior Catholic District School Board's Multi-Year Strategic Plan (MYSP) lists Equitable Stewardship of our Resources as one of its strategic directions. This report relates specifically to aligning available resources with strategic priorities and ensuring schools have the resources they require.

The Information Technology Department is requesting approval to redesign, refresh and secure its wireless network infrastructure in order to accommodate the high usage and reliability of the network. The process will include hiring Access 2 Network Inc. (A2N) to design and implement a new system which includes wireless hardware, software and licensing.

A quotation has been obtained from A2N, which is our current vendor of record and an OECM partner.

Pricing is as follows:

Design and configuration on the wireless network	\$ 16,000.00
Deployment at each school and installation of new wireless gear	\$ 15,000.00
Aruba Central Management software (annual cost)	\$ 37,752.00
New wireless access points	\$ 45,574.26

Total \$114,326.26

This purchase will be made using a Transfer of Payment Agreement from the Ministry of Education labeled Connectivity at Schools Program (CASP). The two-year funding was in the amount of \$242,946. The Board has already spent \$131,325.36. We currently have a remaining balance of \$111,620.64 to be spent before August 31, 2023.
