Working on the STEAM lab room dedicated to Indigenous STEAM The room has the potential to give hands-on STEAM lessons that are based on Indigenous knowledge and ways of knowing. Working with the Indigenous Grad coach at SMC I facilitated beading workshops with the teachers during Faith Day. Faith Day was heavily focused on Truth and Reconciliation, so we made Orange Shirt pins, and had discussions with teachers on residential schools. Facilitated beading at SMC for Orange Shirt Day Pins Indigenous Transitions Coach: The Summer Indigenous Transition Program was a huge success, both virtual and in person. The program was one week (August 22-26, 2022), where students participated in cultural activities and activities that prepared them for their transition to highschool (examples: medicine walk, canoeing, medicine pouch making, mini headdress making, mental health awareness, body positivity, team building and skill development exercises, and much more!) Check in's were completed with the students about their transition, if assistance is needed, or any questions. It was very impactful and most students wanted me to visit them during the school year.
