## Notice of Resolved Lead Water Exceedance [Month, Year]

To all families at [school name]:

Ontario's Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks requires schools, private schools and child care centres to conduct regular testing for lead in drinking water.

As previously notified in [month, year], a plumbing fixture at your child's school was sampled and subsequently exceeded the current standard of 10 micrograms per litre.

## **Corrective Actions**

- The fixture was removed from service.
- [name of local public health unit], Ministry of Education, and Ministry of Environment, Conservation, and Parks notified.
- [list corrective actions taken (e.g. installed NSF Water Filter)]
- Resampled the fixture that exceeded the guideline.
- Continued daily flushing of plumbing fixtures.

## Outcome

The fixture was re-sampled in [month, year]. A "Flushed" sample resulted in a **PASS**, which indicates the sample was at or below the Ontario drinking water quality standard of 10 micrograms per litre.

As a result, this fixture will be placed back in service, and all fixtures for water consumption will continue to be flushed daily.
